As part of our ongoing commitment to holistic learning and awareness, the school will celebrate a series of important national and international days that promote knowledge, sustainability, and social responsibility.





Week & Date	Class	Activity description	Material required	Learning outcomes
Week 1 (1 – 7 Nov)	I–V	<p><u>1NOVEMBER – NATIONAL AUTHOR’S DAY</u></p> <p>National Author’s Day is celebrated on November 1st to honour writers for their contribution to literature and learning. First observed in the United States in 1949, it is now celebrated worldwide to appreciate authors who inspire us through their words and imagination. The day reminds us to read more, write creatively, and value the power of storytelling.</p> <p>Classes I–II: “My Favourite Storybook”</p> <p>□Students will bring their favourite storybook and talk about the author’s name and what they like about the story. They will also draw their favourite character from the book.</p> <p>Classes III–V:“If I Were an Author”</p> <p> Children imagine they are authors and create a title and cover page for a book they would like to write.</p> <p> They can share their idea in a few sentences — “My book would be about...”</p>	 <p>Drawing sheets, crayons, pencil colour</p> <p>A4 sheets, pencils, erasers</p>	<p>These activities aim to help students recognize and appreciate authors while fostering creativity and self-expression. Students will be able to identify the author of a storybook, articulate their preferences about stories and characters, and enhance their listening, speaking, and drawing skills.</p> <p>Students will develop imaginative thinking by creating book titles and cover pages, improve written and verbal communication by sharing their ideas, and build confidence in presenting their original thoughts. Overall, the activities encourage a love for reading, storytelling, and creative writing.</p>

<p>Week 2 (8 – 14Nov)</p>	<p>I–V</p>	<p>10 NOVEMBER WORLD SCIENCE DAY FOR PEACE AND DEVELOPMENT</p> <p>World Science Day for Peace and Development, celebrated on 10 November, highlights the vital role of science in building a more peaceful, sustainable, and equitable world. Established by UNESCO, the day promotes public awareness of science's contributions to society and encourages collaboration between scientists, policymakers, and communities. It serves as a reminder that science is not only a tool for innovation but also a powerful force for solving global challenges and improving lives.</p> <p>Classes I–II: Students will dress up as a scientist of their choice and will speak 2-3 lines about the contribution of that scientist for peace and development.</p> <p>Classes III -V: Students will choose a simple science innovation (e.g., solar panels, vaccines, clean cookstoves) and will write a short paragraph on how it helps people live better and in peace.</p>	 <p>A4 sheets, Pencil, eraser, sketch pens, colours.</p>	<p>This activity enhances students' research and speaking skills by encouraging them to explore real-world scientific solutions and communicate their understanding effectively. As they investigate how a specific innovation contributes to peace and development, they practice gathering relevant information, organizing key points, and presenting them clearly. This process builds confidence in public speaking, strengthens their ability to summarize complex ideas, and develops their overall communication skills.</p>

<p>Week 4 (22 – 28Nov)</p>	<p>I–V</p>	<p><u>26 NOVEMBER CONSTITUTION DAY IN INDIA</u></p> <p>Constitution Day is celebrated on 26 November every year to mark the adoption of the Constitution of India in 1949. It honours Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, the chief architect of the Constitution. It reminds us of the values of justice, equality, liberty, and fraternity that guide our nation.</p> <p>Classes I-V: Students will be shown the following video:</p> <p><u>Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Life Story in English Father of the Indian Constitution Ambedkar Jayanti</u></p> <p>Classes I –II: A fun quiz with simple questions about India, Constitution Day, Dr. Ambedkar will be conducted in class.</p> <p><u>GK Quiz on India India Quiz Question and Answers National Symbols for Kids India GK Quiz Question</u></p> <p>Classes III –V: Students will draw symbols of democracy (Parliament, Ashoka Chakra, etc.) or create posters on rights and duties.</p>	<div data-bbox="857 260 1151 594" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>A4 sheets, sketch pens, colours</p>	<p>Students will gain a basic understanding of the Constitution, its key values, and Dr. B.
