DATE	ACTIVITY	MATERIAL REQUIRED	LEARNING OUTCOME
27.1.2021 (WEDNESDAY)	Let's Build with Clay 	Beautiful coasters will be made with clay or flour dough. Things required for the same- Clay dough or flour dough, poster colours, paint brushes.	Working with the clay/atta dough will help the children to improve their motor skills and make their pincer grip stronger.
28.1.2021 (THURSDAY)	Black is Beautiful 	A charcoal pencil, drawing sheet.	The children will draw themselves and learn the art of shading.
29.1.2021 (FRIDAY)	Play with Paints – Pour painting. 	3-4 shades of acrylic paint, paint brushes, one small terracotta pot (any shape)	The children will learn to make a choice and take decisions when they choose their own colours. Working with paints freely will help them to express themselves. This activity will develop their hand eye coordination as well.
