RULES

Wandering Lens

Wandering Lens is an annual feature of the Literary Event of DPS Mathura Road. With an aim of paying tribute to the literary element of 'coffee-table' photography books, this event gives equal emphasis to the descriptive text/caption provided by the photographer along with the photograph. Wandering Lens shall test the practical abilities of the photographers – not just how they take the photo but how they communicate their perception of the same, which is an integral skill for professional photographers.

Rules:

- Last date for submission is 24 April 2018.
- Entries should be submitted in print with the name and class/section of the student clearly written at the back of each photo.
- The dimensions of the photo should not be smaller than 4”x 6”.
- Date, location and topic of each photograph must be mentioned.
- A descriptive text/caption per photo is mandatory and an integral element of the judgement criteria. The word limit is 1-15 words.
- Photographs may be in colour, black & white or sepia tone.
- Digital manipulation that distorts the reality of the photos will not be allowed.
- If touched up, a copy of the original unedited version of the photo must be provided.
- Entries must be the original and unpublished work of the participant and copyright owner.
- The organisers reserve the right to reproduce any entry in print, broadcast and/or electronic media without requiring the permission of the participant. However, the photographer will be acknowledged.
- Images received through the photography competition will not be used for commercial purposes.

Spell Bee

- Each word will be repeated twice.
- No cutting or over-writing is allowed. The same will be considered ‘incorrect’.
- The students are expected to bring nothing else but their pens and writing boards.
- The decision of the judges will be final and abiding.
- The number of words in the round will be 20.
- The last 5 words will be homophones.
- A maximum of two students from each section may participate.
- The names of the participants are to be given to their respective teachers of English.
- For further information, please contact your teachers of English or the Editorial Board members.

Shakespeare Live

- The students are required to orally render a soliloquy / monologue from any one of Shakespeare’s given plays.
- Time duration of the recitation should not be more than 2 minutes.
- Maximum number of participants should be 2.
- The participants would be marked on their delivery, intonation, pronunciation, expression and clarity.
- The result of the judges would be final and binding.

Dialogue Chronicles

- Only two students are allowed to participate per section.
- Participants may use humour, sarcasm, philosophy to write the dialogues.
- Use of inappropriate language or verbal slurs/ cuss words is strictly forbidden, such entries would be disqualified.
- Time limit of the event will be one hour.

- Participants must return the dialogue sheets to the teachers on duty at the venue.
- Participants are required to give a creative title/ name to the dialogue series.
- OD passes signed by the teacher should be attached to the dialogue sheet.

Weave-a-Rhyme

- Only one student is allowed to participate per section.
- The participants will be provided with a set of pictures, all of which must be used in the composition, but the sequential order will be as per the choice of the participants.
- The poem must have reference to all the pictures presented.
- Participants must submit their composition to the teachers on duty at the venue.
- The participants must give a creative title to the poem composed.

Poet's Shack

- Only two students are allowed to participate per section.
- Use of inappropriate language or verbal slurs/ cuss words is strictly forbidden, such entries would be disqualified.
- OD passes signed by the teacher should be attached to the sheet.
- Plagiarism is strictly forbidden.
- Participants must submit their poems to the teachers on duty at the venue.

Parchment and Ink

- Only two students are allowed to participate per section.
- Use of inappropriate language or verbal slurs/ cuss words is strictly forbidden, such entries would be disqualified.
- OD passes signed by the teacher should be attached to the sheet.
- Plagiarism is strictly forbidden.
- Participants must submit their entries to the teachers on duty at the venue.

Doodle Me

- Only two students are allowed to participate per section.
- Participants must bring their own stationery, only art sheets would be provided at the venue.
- OD passes signed by the teacher should be attached to the doodlesheet.
- Plagiarism is strictly forbidden.
- Participants must submit their entries to the teachers on duty at the venue.
