(6-4-26 to 12-4-26)	I-V	<p><u>7 APRIL : WORLD HEALTH DAY</u> World Health Day is observed every year on 7th April to spread awareness about the importance of good health and well-being. It is organized by the World Health Organization (WHO) and focuses on promoting healthy habits, balanced nutrition, physical fitness, and access to healthcare for all. The day encourages individuals, especially young learners, to adopt simple practices that lead to a healthier lifestyle.</p> <p><u>Classes I-V</u> Students will watch an engaging and age-appropriate video based on healthy habits such as personal hygiene, balanced diet, regular exercise, and cleanliness. https://youtu.be/D5BtnvQqbWs</p> <p><u>Classes I and II</u> Activity: Healthy Plate Drawing Students will draw and colour a “Healthy Plate” showing different food groups such as fruits, vegetables, grains, and proteins. The teacher will guide them about balanced nutrition and the importance of eating healthy food.</p> <p><u>Classes III – V</u> Activity: Fitness Chart Students will prepare a “Fitness Chart” for a week, including activities such as exercise, yoga, healthy eating, and water intake.
