- ✚ Keeping assignments booklets (all subjects), art files, computer and GK textbooks in school cupboard.
- ✚ Having RO water plant to provide safe drinking water to all.
- ✚ Well-designed time table for each classes and strict adherence to it.
- ✚ Random checking of the school bags to ensure that the students are not carrying heavy Bags with unnecessary material.
- ✚ Conducting discussions on related themes.



So, kindly supervise your ward in repacking their bags everyday as per the timetable.

- ✚ Avoid sending heavy drinking water bottles.
- ✚ To use school bags which have broad straps for symmetrical distribution of weight.
