The Constitution of India

Preamble

We, the People of India, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a 'Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic, Republic' and to secure to all its citizens:

Justice, social, economic and political;

Liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith, and worship;

Equality of status and of opportunity; and to promote amongst them all;

Fraternity assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the nation.

In our Constituent Assembly this twenty-sixth day of November 1949, do hereby Adopt, Enact and give to ourselves this constitution.

Fundamental Duties

Fundamental duties: It shall be the duty of every citizen of India:

- (a) To abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag and the National Anthem;
- (b) To cherish and follow the noble ideals which inspired our national struggle for freedom.
- (c) To uphold and protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India;
- (d) To defend the country and render national service when called upon to do so;
- (e) To promote harmony and the spirit of common brotherhood amongst all the people of India transcending religious, linguistic and regional or sectional diversities; to renounce practices derogatory to the dignity of women;
- (f) To value and preserve the rich heritage of our composite culture;
- (g) To protect and improve the natural environment including forests, lakes, rivers and wild life, and to have compassion for living creatures;
- (h) To develop the scientific temper, humanism and the spirit of inquiry and reform;
- (i) To safeguard private property and to abjure violence;
- (j) To strive towards excellence in all spheres of individual and collective activity so that the nation constantly rises to higher levels of endeavour and achievement.
- (k) Who is a parent or guardian to provide opportunities for education to his child or as the case may be, ward between the age of six and fourteen years

Universal Declaration of Human Rights* Preamble

Whereas recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world.

Whereas disregard and contempt for human rights have resulted in barbarous acts which have outraged the conscience of mankind and the advent of a world in which human beings shall enjoy freedom of speech and belief and freedom from fear and want has been proclaimed as the highest aspiration of the common people.

Whereas it is essential, if man is not to be compelled to have recourse, as a last resort, to rebellion against tyranny and oppression, that human rights should be protected by the rule of law.

Whereas it is essential to promote the development of friendly relations between nations.

Whereas the people of the United Nations have in the Charter reaffirmed their faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person and in the equal rights of men and women and have determined to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom.

Whereas Member States have pledged themselves to achieve, in co-operation with the United Nations the promotion of universal respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedom.

Whereas a common understanding of these rights and freedom is of the greatest importance for the full realization of this pledge.

A Brief History of the School

Delhi Public School, Mathura Road established in 1949, functioned from a few tents pitched on the ground cleared from the onslaught of brambles. Today, spread over an area of about 15 acres of lush, green lawns, in the heart of the city, Delhi Public School is a co-educational day-cum-boarding school. The foundation stone of the school building was laid in 1956 by Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the then Vice President of India. The impressive school building today comprises workshops, laboratories, computer centers, audio-visual lecture rooms, libraries, swimming pools, squash courts, clinic, a book shop, the hostel and school canteen.

The school functions under a registered society with eminent educationists, social workers and medical specialists. Ms. Vrinda Sarup is the Chairperson, Managing Committee, DPS Mathura Road; Shri B.K. Chaturvedi is the Chairman, The Delhi Public School Society and Member-Managing Committee, DPS Mathura Road; and Shri V.K. Shunglu is the Vice Chairman, The Delhi Public School Society and Vice Chairman Managing Committee, DPS Mathura Road. Their selfless work along with that of other members needs no testimony.

Delhi Public School offers courses in Humanities, Commerce and Science. It prepares students for the All India Senior School Certificate Examination, conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education.

Keeping in view the ideals of democracy and our ancient culture, Delhi Public School strives to provide a system of education most suited to the needs of our society today. Stress on diverse methods of teaching for different categories of students, opportunities for shouldering responsibilities in school life, constant participation in games and sports, and a wide range of cultural and co-curricular activities lend meaning to our school life. Thus, the end product is the harmonious, all round developed personality of our students.

It is the aim of Delhi Public School to provide the best possible education to its students. Our primary aim is to develop in the student qualities of integrity, honesty, trust, tolerance and compassion, to promote a spirit of enquiry, to foster a scientific temper within the bonds of humanism, to help the student to become a meaningful part of his environment and to know that courage and industry have their due reward.

Towards this end, the school endeavours to provide a large and dedicated teaching staff with a wide range of skills and interests, a varied and wide choice of activities- academic, aesthetic and athletic, an environment enriched with the excitement of discovery, challenge and competitiveness and discipline based on the belief that responsibility comes before freedom.

Special Features of DPS Mathura Road

Delhi Public School is a co-educational school and a member of the Indian Public School Conference.

- The school provides language programmes in foreign languages including French, Japanese
 and German. We also offer language courses in Sanskrit and Urdu. Close liaison is maintained
 with the Cultural Departments of the Embassies of the respective countries. Exchange
 programmes are conducted with Japan and Germany on a regular basis.
- Computer aided teaching is facilitated across subjects and classes through the use of Smart Boards in every classroom.
- The school now features two new Multi Purpose Halls (MPH), an Amphitheatre, and a 24x7 Career Counselling Centre, further enriching the facilities available to students.
- Delhi Public School provides incentive and motivation to its bright students by awarding Scholar Gowns, Scholar Badges, Ties and Gold Medals.
- The school's cafeteria serves wholesome nutritious mid-day meals along with snacks, icecreams, etc. on cash payment at fixed rates subject to prevailing conditions.
- Three well-equipped clinics, with doctors and nurses look after the needs of the students. An
 ambulance with an attendant and driver is stationed at the clinic. Every student undergoes a
 periodic medical check-up; parents / guardians are informed if the child needs specific medical
 attention. An individual medical record is maintained.
- All school books and other articles of stationery may be purchased from the school bookstore
 which remains open during school hours. However, it is not mandatory.
- The school uniform may be purchased from the school uniform shop which remains open during school hours. However, it is not mandatory.

Sports and Games (VI - XII)

Games form an integral and vital part of the school curriculum. Swimming starts at the age of four for all students, and one major team game is a compulsory part of the curriculum from Classes VI to VIII. Special scholarships and coaching facilities are available to sportspersons. The school provides facilities for specialized coaching in various games, including hockey, football, cricket, badminton, basketball, throwball, volleyball, table tennis, swimming, athletics, gymnastics, judo, wrestling, softball, and tennis. **The school has also introduced skating, shooting, and squash as part of its expanding sports offerings.** Two swimming pools are open to all children by turn, even during the summer break. To encourage healthy competition, character building, and physical stamina, Inter-Class competitions are held in all available games for senior and junior boys and girls each year. Moreover, numerous students have represented the school at the State and National levels.

Yoga (VI - XII)

The school accepts and acknowledges the multi-dimensional advantages of Yoga and Meditation. It has been absorbed into the weekly time-table schedule. Classes are conducted under the guidance of a trained Yoga teacher.

Chess

Student Prefectorial Body

Social leadership and responsibility are best learnt through active participation. A number of student appointments, selected after a careful scrutiny of their school records, are entrusted with various responsibilities and share the task of maintaining decorum in the school. Senior student appointments meet the Principal and Vice Principal periodically. The junior wing has a similar system of student appointments.

The various Clubs/ Councils have a selected group of students appointed from Class XII since they are Board examinees. The remaining Appointments are chosen from Class XI. The senior most appointments are the Head Boy and Head Girl under whose guidance the various groups perform their respective duties. Sports occupy a significant position and the sports appointments are important in promoting the spirit of sportsmanship.

This Prefectorial Body comprising nearly 75 members gets selected through an impartial, democratic process. It is voluntary and the selection procedure involves a detailed round of group discussion, 3 interview rounds and even a psychoanalysis test supervised by the Reps of Class XI and XII, the Club In-charge and Heads of Departments. In the final round the short listed candidates are interviewed by the Principal.

Once selected, the appointments are guided and supervised by faculty members appointed to their specific Club/Council to organise, and manage the year-long activities of the concerned Club/Council. The ultimate aim is to give interested students the experience of working and managing a small group with specific objectives, thus shaping and honing leadership qualities which will hold them in good stead in the future.

Students' Bulletin

To encourage creative expression, children with a flair for writing are given an opportunity to contribute articles and sketches for the annual magazine – The Annual, the environment e-newsletter – Green Gene and the Economics Magazine.

Parent-Teacher Association

The PTA meetings, held throughout the year for every class regularly, give an opportunity to the parents and teachers to meet and discuss the progress of the children. The PTA has opened a Benevolent Fund to help and educate children who unfortunately lose their earning parent while they are still studying in the school. This gesture has been greatly appreciated by young widows who would otherwise find it difficult to educate their children at DPS. Women, who unfortunately fall victim to these circumstances, should apply every year to the Principal and Secretary, PTA for exemption of tuition fee for their children.

Library

The school library is open to all bonafide students of the school during school hours. All classes are provided with one library period per week.

Almanac 2025-2026 =

- 1. Students must carry their RFID cards. Books are issued for a fortnight.

A Digital Library, also called an online library, an internet library, a digital repository or a digital collection is an online database of digital objects. In today's digital age of knowledge and resource sharing, DPS Mathura Road has empowered its users through its digital content via the digital library. It gives the students and staff access to multiple content with a potentially infinite number of resources and selections at hand. It also provides access to an expansive collection of materials with increased convenience because users can access the library from anywhere with an internet connection. Powerful search and sorting features help in narrowing results and multimedia content which is not available in the physical library.

SMS

Under the new ERP System, the school avails the SMS facility to keep the parents informed about their ward's performance, behaviour, attendance, upcoming tests and appreciation of their child's outstanding performance.

Note:

- 1. Parents are expected to ensure that their wards are in proper uniform, with RFID, before leaving home.
- 2. Jersey (bottle green) plain, 'V' neck (sleeves optional) to be worn by boys and girls during winter.
- 3. For all children, boys and girls alike, proper footwear in both summer and winter is black canvas shoes with laces. No shoes of any other colour/kind nor chappals/floaters/high-heeled shoes are permissible. White canvas shoes may be worn only for Games/PT/Meditation/Yoga. In winter, students who wear grey stockings should have them held up by elastic garters so that they do not sag at the ankles.
- 4. The cut of the trouser should be straight. Fancy trousers like flares or bell bottoms or drain pipes, etc. are not permitted.
- 5. The school uniform (shirt / tie / belt / blazer) must carry the school logo.
- 6. All boys (except Sikhs) must keep their hair short. Girls must tie their hair back neatly with a bottle green hair band or ribbon.
- 7. Girls are not permitted to wear expensive, ostentatious articles of jewellery like bracelets, dangling earrings or bangles or put on nail paint. Nails to be neatly trimmed.
- 8. As long as a student is on the school rolls, he/she must come to school in uniform.
- 9. Students must carry simple school bags.
- 10. Boys must be clean-shaven. They are not allowed to sport a beard without the permission of the authorities except on religious or medical grounds.
- 11. If students are not found in proper uniform, they will be sent back home and an external memo will be issued. Strict compliance of uniform should be followed as per guidelines.
- 12. Students from Classes XI-XII should carry (shirt / tie / belt / blazer) their shoes and sports kit for their Physical Education classes. However, they should change back into their regular uniform, once the period is over. This is also to be strictly followed by students going for dance practice, self-defence classes or any other co-curricular activity.
- 13. Jackets/sweatshirts are strictly prohibited. If found wearing the same, they will be confiscated.
- 14. Students should remain habitually clean and always turn up neatly dressed in school uniform.
 Use of hair gel is not allowed. Low-waist trousers and short skirts are prohibited.

RFID Attendance System

The School has introduced the RFID attendance system. All students are issued a card for which no fee is charged, however, a nominal fee is payable for providing the services. The RFID card is to be submitted back in case of withdrawal or on passing out on completion of schooling.

Students to compulsorily wear their RFID card properly, instead of merely keeping it in the school bag or pocket.

Parents will receive messages on their registered mobile numbers only when a student follows the timings as per details given below:

If a student does not follow the above timings, no message will be generated; however, the student is covered under the tracking system.

If a card is lost or damaged, a duplicate card will be issued on a payment of Rs. 500/-.

Transport

The provision of school transport is not a matter of right but a facility provided to students. Bus facility for new admissions or students who change their address is subject to its availability.

For Safety and Security of Students

As per CBSE guidelines, Lady Guards / attendants have been deployed on every school bus route for the safety & security of students. The lady guards / attendants board their respective buses from the first pick-up point of students and disembark at the last drop-off point. In the morning all the bus user students are dropped in the school campus (Vehicle Parking Area) and in the afternoon they board their respective buses from there only. In case of emergency, parents can contact the lady guards/attendants on their mobile numbers available on the school website.

Transport Rules

For a safe journey to school, the following rules are to be followed by the students:

- 1. Students can only get on/off from their fixed bus stops.
- 2. Students can only travel by their assigned buses. Even on request students will not be permitted to do otherwise.
- 3. At the end of the school day, students should board their respective buses immediately and not move out. They should remain seated till the buses leave.
- 4. Students should not run to the bus but walk in a queue. They should not jump on or off a moving bus. They should not push each other while getting on or off the bus.
- 5. Maintain discipline in the bus as any mischief will disturb the driver.
- 6. While in the bus, students should not stretch their head or hands out of the bus.
- 7. Cooperate with the staff on duty and abide by the instructions given by them from time to time.
- 8. Never stand in front or behind a stationary bus.
- 9. Students violating the above rules will be punished strictly which may debar the student from availing bus facilities, suspension or expulsion from the school.

Discontinuation of Bus Service

For Class X and XII students – Request for discontinuation of bus service for Class X and XII students will not be considered after the second quarter (July - September). In case of no request received by the end of September, the student must pay the bus fee for the entire academic session.

For all other classes except Class X and XII - In case of discontinuation of bus service on or before the 10th of a month, bus fee will be charged till the end of the month.

Note: Any problem, suggestion or comment regarding transport should be brought to the notice of the Principal / Vice Principal or Transport Department immediately.

School Rules

Parents/ Students Are Advised To Read The Contents Of The Almanac Carefully And Abide By The Rules Laid Down By The School Authorities Religiously.

- 1. The students must carry the Almanac to school daily.
- 2. Students will not be allowed to enter the school on short leave. In case of a medical or any other emergency the child will be allowed to leave the school. A gate pass will be issued from the office of the Vice Principal. The child should be accompanied either by parents or an authorised person.
- Students who come to school on their own should reach the school punctually. The school gate will close at 7:20 A.M. (summer timings); 7:35 A.M. (winter timings). Late arrivals will be sent home immediately.
- 4. Parents and guardians are not allowed to enter the school during school hours without prior appointment. An appointment can be fixed on the telephone 011-43399200 / 241 or through the official e-mail address given on the school website.
- 5. Parents must ensure that their ward is in proper school uniform and carry RFID at all times.
- 6. It is not allowed illegal to bring a mobile phone to school and once it is confiscated it will not be returned to the parent. Electronic watches and other electronic devices are banned in the school. The students should not be permitted to carry any electronic communication device including those that can store/record/play audio-visual content; transmit or receive images; or provide unfiltered connection to the internet such as I-Pads, Pen drives DVD/CD players, game consoles, handheld PC, smart phones, laptops, tablet or any other gadget with similar capabilities of data storage/transmission, etc. It is reiterated that unmonitored use of any electronic communication device is strictly prohibited in school as per the direction of the CBSE. The students must not bring cigarettes, e-cigarettes, e-hookah, deodorants/ perfumes, explosive material/ crackers and sharp tools/ knives to school. The parents are advised to check the bags of their wards before they depart for school. Non-compliance will lead to strict/appropriate disciplinary action.

- 7. Buying / selling / using e-cigarettes/hookah/tobacco/vape in or around a 100 yards radius of the school campus is totally banned and is a punishable offence. If anybody is found indulging in the aforementioned activities, strict disciplinary action would be taken against them. (As per the provisions of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act COTPA 2003).
- 8. Regarding complaints pertaining to bullying, smoking and sexual abuse the parents can lodge the same at e-mail IDs provided under **Safety and Security on page 30.**Complaint Boxes have also been installed within the school premises in which students/parents may drop their written complaints.
- 9. The students can avail of the 'Accidental Insurance' facility provided by the school.
- Changing of classrooms between periods should be done in an orderly and silent manner.
 Students should not unnecessarily leave their class at the end of every period.
- 11. Children are advised to use the washroom in the home room period or during a change of period. They must return to the class within 2 minutes. In case of an emergency, they must inform the teacher concerned and return within 2-3 minutes.
- 12. Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are shabbily dressed or not in uniform will be sent home. Use of hair gel is not allowed. Wearing low waist trousers and short skirts is forbidden.
- 13. All boys (except Sikhs) must keep their hair short. Girls must tie their hair neatly with a green band.
- 14. Non-Sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals. Sikh boys must wear bottle green turbans in Class IX and above. A patka may be worn only while playing games.
- 15. No books (other than text books or library books) or magazines should be brought to the school.
- 16. Lending or borrowing of money or other articles is not allowed.
- 17. Students who come to school escorted should never leave before the escort arrives. In case of delay, they should report to the school security officer at the reception.

- 18. Students are not allowed to use the school telephone. However, in case of an emergency, only the Class Teacher/ Reps / Coordinators will contact the parents at the earliest.
- 19. The school does not permit the celebration of birthdays or festivals in the school campus.
 Parents are advised not to send sweets, cakes etc. with children for celebration of birthdays.
 Exchange of gifts is also not allowed. Birthday bumps are a punishable offence.
- 20. Care must be taken by the members of staff and all students to observe the "Green Rules" in order to maintain clean and green surroundings. That is, school premises will not be littered with disposable tumblers, papers or polythene bags. Single use plastic items are strictly prohibited in the school premises.
- 21. Students are advised to keep their class room, school buildings and campus as clean as possible, and throw leftovers into the dustbins. They should not spoil or pluck flowers.
- 22. Students are expected to respect school property. No student should damage / be involved in damaging any school furniture; write or draw anything on the walls or in any way damage things belonging to others. Any school property damaged even by accident should be reported at once to the Class teacher / Class Reps / Coordinators / Vice-Principals/ Principal.
- 23. Delhi Public School students should invariably be polite wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet their teachers whenever they meet them.
- 24. Proper care of the Smart Boards should be ensured by all the students of the class, students must ensure that they are not tampered with. Smart Boards have to be taken care of by all the students of the class. The students of the class will be responsible for any damage to the same.
- 25. Students are prohibited from damaging the RFID card readers and CCTV cameras installed in the school premises. Such misconduct would invite strict disciplinary action.
- 26. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles (like expensive watches/ fountain pens, cash, jewellery/bracelets/ear studs etc.) to school.
- 27. DPS provides education from Pre-school to Class XII. Therefore, it is expected that the

- juniors be treated with love and affection, while the juniors show respect to their seniors.
- 28. Fee can be paid by cheque/draft or online within the stipulated time.
- 29. As per the Directorate of Education, no student shall indulge in any of the following practices:
- i. Absence from classes without the permission of the teacher / Vice Principals / Principal
- ii. Misbehaviour towards teachers or any other employee of the school
- iii. Disobeying laws / orders of the teacher / Vice Principals / Principal
- iv. Intentional disturbance of classes
- v. Eve teasing / Misbehaviour towards girl students
- vi. Bringing unauthorized people / article inside the school
- vii. Indulging in acts of moral turpitude.
- viii. Any behavior unbecoming of a student
- ix. Carrying and using mobile phones
- x. Misuse of Smart Board
- xi. Use of motor vehicle like scooty / moped etc by the students and bringing these in the school
- xii. Theft of school / students property
- xiii. Propogating a strike / disruption of classes
- xiv. Association with banned organisations
- xv. Spitting and littering in the school premises
- xvi. Disfiguring or damaging school property
- xvii. Writing on the shirts and uniform
- xviii. Smoking or consuming any harmful substances like gutka, pan masala etc
- xix. Any form of gambling
- xx. Use of drugs or intoxicants vaping is strictly prohibited
- xxi. Rowdyism and rude behavior
- xxii. Use of violence / or bullying in any form (physical/verbal), which may harm any student physically or mentally
- xxiii. Any form of cyber-crime
- xxiv. Discrimination of any kind Casteism, Communalism or practice of untouchability
- xxv. **Bursting crackers or throwing colour** on one another within the school premises
- xxvi. Bunking classes

All the above acts of misconduct are forbidden practices. In case of any of the above acts of misconduct, Principal / HOS shall take suitable action as per observation of the Disciplinary Committee at school. The observance of rules of discipline and good behavior shall be a condition essential to a student's continuation in the school. In case of breach of discipline by a student, appropriate disciplinary action will be taken as specified under Disciplinary Measures on Page 29.

- 32. No student is allowed to visit any of the kiosks situated outside the school, and if found doing so, he/she will be subjected to punishment as per school rules.
- 33. Students using the school bus will maintain discipline in the bus. If he/she creates any indiscipline, he/she will be deprived of the bus facility. **Kindly refer to the Transport Rules** as listed in the Almanac.
- 34. Students indulging in aggressive or violent behaviour, will not be allowed to travel by school bus. They will be picked and dropped to school by their parents.
- 35. A Clinic proforma from Class Teacher /Subject Teacher signed by the teacher (in charge of a period) must be carried by a child going to the clinic for treatment.
- 36. A vaccination record must be produced at the beginning of the session.
- 37. Canteen facility is only available during the break time or after the school is over. (subject to prevailing conditions)
- 38. Students will not boycott the orders, directions and instructions given to them by the school authorities.
- 39. Children are not allowed to take photographs of any friend or student, teacher, Vice Principals or Principal in the school campus without his/her prior permission. They are not allowed to upload any such material on any social site without prior permission of the concerned student or teacher.
- 40. Students using unfair means during examination will face disciplinary action as decided by the school authorities.
- 41. The school reserves the right to suspend or to take strict disciplinary action against a student whose diligence or progress in studies is consistently unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.

Note: The school reserves the right to modify the rules without prior notice.

Disciplinary Measures

The following measures will be adopted by the school authorties, as per observation and understanding the gravity of the misconduct, to enforce discipline. This is with regard to offences pertaining to the aforementioned aspects and for other activities of indiscipline.

- Counselling
- Oral / Written warning to the students and parents
- 3. Issue of External Memos / Show Cause Notices
- 4. Suspension from attending classes/school for a specified period
- 5. Withdrawal of Break / PT Periods
- 6. Community Service / Social Service
- 7. Withholding or cancelling the results
- 8. Withdrawal of bus facilities for misbehaviour in the school bus. In this case, parents would be responsible for dropping their wards to school and picking them up.
- Loss to school property due to willful damage will be made good through replacement of school property/imposition of fine/ strict action.
- 10. Detention during the break for completion of neglected class work, home work
- 11. Rustication and expulsion as per rules
- 12. Roll Numbers / Admit Cards of students who do not follow the school rules or behave in an undisciplined manner may be withheld based on the Code of Conduct issued by the CBSE.
- 13. In case a student is found using unfair means during a test/exam, the paper will be cancelled and no retest would be offered.

Note – Breaking or violating any other Rule, the punishment for which is not prescribed here, will be a matter or decision of the school authority after observing the gravity of the conduct and behaviour of the student in the past. The punishment imposed will be final.

Safety and Security

In accordance with CBSE guidelines, individual committees have been constituted to look into the safety and security of the students. Students, parents and teachers can mail their complaints, if any, to the **complaints@dpsmathuraroad.org**. Once registered the complaint will be effectively dealt with by all members of the respective committees. Strict action will be taken against the following offences:

a) Anti-Bullying Committee

Bullying is strictly prohibited inside the school premises and no act will go unnoticed or unpunished. It can be directly from the bully to the victim (e.g., through physical intimidation or attacks, verbal abuse, unwanted attention and advances, damaging property), or it can be indirect (e.g., through spreading malicious rumours). It can also include cyber-bullying (e.g., sending unpleasant SMS messages, photographs or emails, to the victim or to others). Guidelines for prevention of Bullying and Ragging in Schools as stated in circular No. Acad.-17/ 2015 dated 9 March 2015 have been strictly implemented.

The committee will ensure a 100% Tobacco-free school that prohibits the use of tobacco products by anyone, including students, staff and visitors in the school premises or at school events at all times. It has been constituted for a mass campaign against the smoking menace in the school.

POCSO ACT

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences act 2012 provides protection to children from sexual abuse and prescribes punishment by way of imprisonment and fine for sexual offences against the children. Measures taken by our school as proposed by the CBSE:

- Management and staff are made aware about the provisions of POCSO ACT.
- Self-defence training programme for girls.
- Appropriate training for staff to address their responsibilities to protect children from abuse.
- Police verification and psychometric evaluation of all staff and non-teaching staff like bus drivers, conductors, peons.
- Installation of CCTV cameras.
- Constitution of parent-teacher-students committee to address students' safety needs.
- Monthly safety audit of the school premises by the parent representatives and personnel from local police stations.
- Display of toll-free number and child helpline on the notice board with the names of the teacher designated to handle such cases.
- Controlled access to school building by outsiders and monitoring of visitors through surveillance system installed at the main gate.
- Sensitization of students against undue sexual advances and immediate reporting, through workshops conducted regularly

Attendance

- It is compulsory for all students to complete 75% attendance before every exam to make them eligible to sit for the examination. In case attendance is short, students will not be eligible for promotion/any academic award.
- 2. Adequate preparatory leave is given before each exam. It is mandatory for students to attend school till the last working day.
- 3. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than ten consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls; re-admission may be granted only on payment of fresh admission fee provided the vacancy still exists.
- 4. All children are expected to attend school on the opening day after every vacation and must be present before closing for the vacations. Those absent because of sickness must present a medical certificate within 3 days of absence through fax, a representative or on the school's official email ID provided on the school website.
- 5. A child returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a fitness certificate from a doctor.
- 6. Students suffering from any one of the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.

i. Chicken pox - Till complete falling of scabs.

ii. Cholera - Till the child is completely well.

iii. Measles - Two weeks after the rash disappears.

iv. Mumps - Until the swelling has gone.

v. Whooping cough - Six weeks
vi. Jaundice - Six weeks
vii. H1N1 - Six weeks
viii. Swine Flu - Six weeks

ix. Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease – Till complete recovery

- 7. Only those students will be put 'On Duty' who represent the school while playing a tournament, a sport or participate in any other event. Any student, not representing the school, will have no such claim.
- 8. Proper permission by the Event In-charge, duly signed by Vice Principal (Administration), must be carried by students 'On Duty'.
- In case of long, uninformed absence on the part of a Board Examinee, three external memos
 would be issued followed by a show-cause notice and the matter would be sent to the CBSE
 for further action.

Criteria for Academic Awards for the Year 2025-2026

- 1 The **eligibility criteria** for being declared a SCHOLAR is as follows:
- Minimum Attendance: 80% for Classes VI-X;

75% for Classes XI-XII

- Scholastic Areas:
- Classes VI- VIII: 85% and above in all subjects including the 3rd language
- Classes IX- X: 85% and above in all five academic subjects.
- Class XI: 80% and above in all five academic subjects.
- Class XII: 8-Years Scholar (from Class IV to Class XI in succession) and securing 90% and above in four main subjects and 85% and above in English in the Board Exams (AISSCE).
- Co- Scholastic Areas:
- Classes VI- XII: The student must score a minimum Grade A in each: SEWA project/Work Experience/Art Education/ Physical and Health Education/ Life Skills/ Attitudes / Co- Scholastic Activities.

Note:-

- * 2020-2021(except class X and XII) and 2021-2022 (except class X and XII) will be considered as zero years for calculating 6 years, 8 years and 9 years scholar.
- * No proximity criterion will be applicable for the Board Results of Class X (AISSE) and XII (AISSCE). CBSE Board Result will be considered as final and binding.
- * Marks of the 6th subject will not be considered for the eligibility criteria for being declared a Scholar.
- * The school shall be the custodian of the declared awards for a period of one academic year from the date of Annual Award Ceremony (Scholar Badge Ceremony) for the respective class.
- **The students who have taken a transfer (TC) from the school will not be eligible for accolades during the Annual Award Ceremony.

The following students will not be eligible for receiving any Academic Award:

- A student who is guilty of breaching the school rules and indulging in misconduct such as indiscipline, bullying, fighting, cheating, using foul/ abusive language, etc.
- A student who is found in possession of mobile phone and smart watch in school.
- A student who has appeared for any Retest/ Re Exam.

<u>Criteria for being considered as a Scholar for New Admissions:</u>

- Only students of Delhi Public Schools (core/ satellite) are eligible.
- The student will be eligible for any academic accolade only after completing one academic year at DPS Mathura Road.
- He/ she must submit the following documents with a covering letter to the Class Rep by July 31, 2025:
- Photocopy of Result of the qualifying class issued by the last school attended; in case of Class X, Mark Sheet issued by CBSE.
- Copy of all the previous Scholar Certificates received from the school last attended.
- The academic achievements of the student in his/her past school collected above will be considered to determine the number of scholar years of the students since he/she joined DPS Mathura Road.

(Decision of the School Committee is final and binding.)

Accolades given to students:

- Gown: Students receiving Scholar Badge for three consecutive years are given a Blue Blazer made to their size by the school.
- Gold Medal: Students receiving Scholar Badge for six consecutive years are given a Gold Medal along with a Blue Blazer made to their size by the school.
- **Silver Medal:** Students receiving Scholar Badge for six years with a one year gap are given a Silver Medal along with a Blue Blazer made to their size by the school. The Silver Medalist will not receive a Gold Medal on becoming a scholar for six years.
- Gold Medal at 9 Years: Students of Class XII who have been scholars for eight years in succession are given a Gold Medal, provided they secure 90% and above in four main subjects and 85% and above in English in the Board Exams (AISSCE).

- * **Gown**: Students receiving Scholar Badge for three consecutive years (the pre-pandemic scholar year and the following years with offline examination in school will be considered as scholar years).

Important Guidelines for Board Examinees (X and XII)

Registration

Students studying in schools affiliated to CBSE and desirous of availing the exemptions / concessions should approach the concerned regional office of CBSE through the Head of their Institution preferably while in Class IX and / or XI. The request should be supported by the relevant medical certificate and recommendation from the Head of the School / Institution. Only those students would be considered for grant of exemption / concession in whose respect relevant category has been entered during registration in Class IX and / or XI.

Exam Preparation

- You know your strengths and weaknesses the best Plan your entire schedule around your strong and weak points. Give more time to the topics you're less thorough with.
- In the board exams, you'll see a pattern of questions asked repeatedly. Be thorough with those and prepare according to the paper style.
- Sleep well a night before the exam and have a healthy breakfast the next morning.
- The candidates must visit the examination centre at least one day prior to the date of examination so that they can reach before 10:00 A.M. on the days of examination.
- The candidates should leave for the examination centre keeping in view weather conditions, traffic conditions, etc.
- Have faith in your hard work and your preparations.

During the Exam

- All the candidates need to appear for the exam in school uniform.
- Students must compulsorily carry their school IDs to the Examination Centre without which entry into the centre is not permitted.
- Students must carry their stationery. (Blue/Royal Blue Ink/Ball Point/Gel Pen (3-4), pencil, eraser, sharpener, ruler, etc.) in a transparent stationery pouch.
- Students may carry a transparent writing board (board on which the answer sheet is attached to write the exam).
- Barred Items: Textual material (printed or written), bits of papers, pen drives, calculator, log table, electronic pen/scanner, etc. are not allowed to be carried into the examination hall. Any communication device such as mobile phone, bluetooth, earphones, microphone, pager, health band, camera, analog or digital watches, etc. are not allowed.
- Students must not write / put their name / signature or any other sign or mark which may disclose their identity to the examiner, anywhere in the answer book.

- Presentation of the paper is important:
 - ► Handwriting must be neat and legible.
 - ▶ Proper spacing must be maintained between the words and lines so that it's easy for the examiner to comprehend the answers.
 - ▶ Diagrams should be drawn only with a pencil and the labelling must be done with pencil only.
 - ▶ Effort should be made to write the answers in points. Bunching all sentences together must be avoided. At least two lines must be left before and after each question so that in case of wanting to add content later, there's enough space left.

• Time Management is essential:

- ▶ Make good use of the 15 minutes reading time.
- ▶ Read the question paper carefully so that you can organise your thoughts and manage your time well through the exam.
- ▶ While writing the paper, adhere to the word limit and time limit to be allocated for attempting questions of different weightage.
- ▶ Do not spend more time on a section that carries relatively less marks.
- ▶ In numerical questions, copy the data correctly from the question paper, or from one step of the problem to the next. Also, do convert the data into appropriate units.
- ▶ Do not waste time on questions you are not sure of or those which are time consuming.
- ► Come back to answer them only when you are through with all that you know.
- ▶ Don't get distracted by any external factors.
- ► Keep some time for revision and check whether you have answered all the questions you know.
- Diagrams, where required, should be neat and labelled.

Instructions for Students during Examinations

- On exam days, students should come to school on time and immediately report to their allotted examination venue.
- 2. Students should come in proper uniform with their school identity card and occupy their seats at the allotted place only with the examination material in a transparent pouch.
- 3. Students who are late will not be given extra time.
- 4. Students are required to bring their own stationery items. No borrowing, lending or exchange of any material is allowed during the exam.
- 5. Students should carry their own transparent water bottle.
- 6. Students must write their name, roll number, class and section on the top right corner of the question paper.
- 7. No rough work is to be done on the question paper.
- 8. Only essential writing materials are allowed on the student's desk. All bags and books should be left at the front of the respective classroom.
- 9. Students should not carry any electronic gadget such as mobile phones, calculators, smart watches, communication devices, etc. to the examination venue. If any such item is found in possession of the student, it will be confiscated on non-returnable basis and the student will be liable to strict disciplinary action.
- 10. Without the permission of the invigilator, students are not allowed to move outside the classroom during examination for any reason.
- 11. During the course of examination, if a student is found indulging in any of the following, he/she shall be deemed to have used unfair means for examination and the paper will be cancelled and he/ she will be marked zero for that particular examination.
- having in possession, papers, books, notes, calculators, electronic gadgets, communication devices or any other material or information relevant to the subject examination concerned;
- giving or receiving assistance directly/ indirectly of any kind or attempting to do so; both the parties shall be punished;
- writing questions or answers on any material other than the answer book;
- tearing of any page of the answer book or supplementary answer book, etc.;
- contacting or communicating or trying to do so with any person, other than the invigilator, during the examination time;
- taking away the answer book out of the examination room;
- smuggling out answer book/ supplementary answer sheet or part thereof.
- using or attempting to use any other undesirable method or means in connection with the examination.
- 12. Students to maintain complete silence and discipline inside the classroom and are required to abide by the instructions of the invigilator. Misbehaviour in the examination room/ hall (disobedience or unruly conduct) will call for immediate disciplinary action.
- 13. No supplementary sheets will be given to the students in the last 5 minutes of the examination.
- 14. No student shall be allowed to leave the room in the first half an hour and the last half an hour of the stipulated examination duration.
- 15. Leave the examination hall quickly and quietly after the exam. Remember to take all your belongings with you.

- Fulbright, Chevening, etc.: These scholarship exams have varying application and exam dates, depending on the scholarship program. Most deadlines are in the fall of the year prior to study.

These exams are key steps for students planning to study abroad. It's recommended to start preparations early to ensure ample time for studying, registration, and receiving results before application deadlines. Always double-check program details and admission deadlines of individual universities.

Documents are required for Studying Abroad

- 1. <u>Letter of recommendation (LOR) –</u> Students require Letter of recommendation (LOR) while applying to different universities. The LOR should be from a faculty member of your education institute or the school counsellor in general. Generally, all international universities look for two LORs from Subject teachers and one from the school counsellor which talks about overall co-curricular and academic achievements of the student applicant. All LORs must be verified by concerned teachers/counsellor and forwarded at *pavp@dpsmathuraroad.org* for final printing on the school letterhead. No changes will be made once the LOR has been printed on the school letterhead.
- 2. <u>Statement of Purpose (SOP) Apart from the LOR</u>, students also need to submit a Statement of Purpose highlighting their achievements and learnings.
 - Some of the universities demand Admission Essays in place of Statement of Purpose. Essays are generally required for pursuing specific courses. SOPs and Essays should be originally written by the applicant and reviewed by their English Language Faculty members. Students may need to sit with their subject teachers and school counsellor for development of the Letter of Recommendations (LOR'S) and Statement of Purpose (SOP'S)
- 3. **School Transcript-** Mark Sheets from Grade IX-XII are converted into a one-page document on the school letter head after verifying the original marksheets submitted by the student through email at: pavp@dpsmathuraroad.org, attested by the school Principal/Vice Principals.
- 4. <u>Predicted Scores/Expected Scores in Class XII AISSCE Examination</u>- Students will require to submit their predicted scores for their final result prediction. In order to get their predicted scores from all their subject teachers they will have to request them personally to email their expected score in class XII final examination at pavp@dpsmathuraroad.org. Once all expected score for each of their subjects has been received, the document will, be prepared and student will be informed to collect the same from the Vice Principals office personally. No change in marks will be entertained once the document has been prepared.

Procedure and Guidelines for applying abroad through school:-

Following documents duly attested by school authorities along with their college applications must be submitted to school counsellor via email at **astha@dpsmathuraroad.org**, for uploading on commonapp.org/coalition etc. two weeks prior to your application deadline.

- (a) Scanned pdfs of original mark sheets, certificates, etc. of Classes IX-XII, duly attested by the school
- (b) Scanned pdf of Predicted marksheet for the A. I. S.S. C.E. duly signed by respective subject -teachers and attested by school authorities
- (c) Course content of Classes IX-XII, duly attested by the school
- (d) A Scanned Pdf of the school transcript with the following details:
- 1. Date of joining the school
- 2. Subjects taken in Classes IX-XII
- 3. Marks obtained in all the subjects in classes IX, X and XI
- 4. Marks obtained in the Half-yearly exams of Class XII
- (e) Essay, as per the topic & guidelines given in the application form
- (f) Scanned pdf file of LOR given by the school counsellor
- (g) Student's Profile or a Bio-Data

- FOR UK Application via UCAS system- you must email your LOR along with your predicted scores mentioned on the same page converted in word file document format at astha@dpsmathuraroad.org
- 2. For applying manually, students are required to collect school letter heads and envelopes after submitting an application to their respective coordinator or Vice Principal from the Records Room/ Main office. Signature of the Principal or Education Counsellor and school stamp on all envelopes will be required through schools' main office before the envelopes are dispatched. (Mandatory for US applications).
- 3. All documents must be submitted 2 weeks in advance e.g.: application forms, photocopies for signature and attestation, recommendation details etc. for perusal by the Principal and Counsellor.

Preferably, students should appear for these exams in Class XI (May, June, Oct, Jan) or in Class XII (May, June, Oct, Nov).

For US admissions, early decision/early action deadlines are in Nov. (Class XII) and most of regular decisions applications must be postmarked latest by 1st Jan of the final year.

Some Universities also offer rolling admissions (i.e., round the year).

The deadline for NTU (Nanyang Technological University) and NUS (Singapore) is April, for SMU (Singapore) it is in the first week of April, after Class XII board examinations.

For UK admissions, the deadline for submitting applications is much later.

However, it is advisable for a student enrolled in class XII to complete the application process by Jan-Feb.
